ARTICLE FOUR: COMMITTEES

Section 1: Purposes of Committees

The Central Committee may decide, from time to time, to create committees and delegate portions of its power to these committees. These committees shall be responsible for overseeing any manner of business the Central Committee sees fit. The Central Committee and its delegates retain ultimate authority and may countermand any decision of these committees. These committees shall not contradict the bylaws of the Canadian Socialist Rifle Association. The purpose and powers of committees shall be publicized to the membership at the time of their creation, and a record of the composition of these committees retained for review by the membership.

Section 2: Formation

Any committee may be formed by a simple majority approval vote of the Central Committee. All committees shall have a clear and defined purpose. The power to select members of committees from the membership may be vested in either the Central Committee or the Chair of a Committee. Any committee concerning the Canadian Socialist Rifle Association as a whole should, if possible, have members selected from chapters in each province.

Section 3: Electoral Committee

During every election held by the Canadian Socialist Rifle Association a committee shall be formed to oversee the electoral process and report to the membership the results of their findings. The Central Committee shall select members of good standing who are well respected within the organization to fill this committee, with the number of committee members to be selected being no less than three. No current member of the Central Committee, no current officer, nor any candidate for these positions may be selected for this committee.

This committee shall have the authority to examine any candidates running for election, to examine any processes and service used to conduct the election, to communicate with and examine the work of the secretary who certifies the election, and to notify the entirety of the membership of their findings and analysis of the election.
